How is your green plastic recycling bin holding up?

If your answer is “good” then disregard the rest of this message.

New recycling bins are available for those who never received a recycling bin in 1990 when recycling became a law in New York State and in Madison County; or for those whose bin may have been run over by a truck or blew away in a wind storm. And, remember only one bin per household. Residents receiving a new bin will be asked to sign the County’s Recycling Bin Distribution form.

The current distribution effort is part of a three year program by Madison County’s Department of Solid Waste to provide new recycling bins to households in Madison County by the end of 2011 and to help every school in Madison County improve their recycling programs.

Bins are currently available for residential pick up at any of the County’s four transfer stations during normal operating hours: the Buyea Rd. transfer station located across the street from the County Landfill in the Town of Lincoln; Bolivar Rd. in the Town of Sullivan; Constine Bridge Rd. in the Town of Cazenovia; and Cranston Rd. in the Town of Hamilton.

Recycling bins are also available in Brookfield from the Highway Department, in Cazenovia, DeRuyter and Nelson at the Town Offices, at the Landfill Office on Buyea Rd. and from the Public Information Officer/Recycling Coordinator’s basement office in the County Office Bldg in Wampsville.

“It is our hope that this three year project will be partially funded by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC),” explained Driscoll who is waiting for word from the DEC regarding the equipment grant she submitted for review in November of 2008.”
