

## **Youth Development/Delinquency Prevention (YDDP) Funding**

YDDP funds are targeted for the provision of services that address the needs (as identified in the Child & Family Services Plan) of the general youth population of Madison County. Funds in this category reimburse up to 50% of approved program costs. The agency must provide a local dollar for dollar match.

The following programs/agencies were awarded YDDP funding by the Madison County Youth Bureau and Youth Board to provided services, opportunities and supports for children & youth in Madison County in 2010:

**INROADS - \$15,000.00** - Operated by [BRiDGES, Council on Alcoholism & Substance Abuse](#). The INROADS program offers a comprehensive student assistance program for students in grades 7-12 in the Oneida, DeRuyter and Stockbridge Valley school districts. Services include the Botvin Life Skills curriculum, alcohol/substance abuse prevention and education, intervention and referral services for youth who abuse alcohol, tobacco or other drugs, and supportive services for youth at risk. The program also provides teacher/staff training and consultation. For more information call 697-3947.

**Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) Program - \$3,077.00** - Operated by the [Madison County Sheriff's Department](#). The program is a 17-week drug education and resistance program taught by a specially trained D.A.R.E. Officer. It teaches strategies in dealing with the dangers of illicit and illegal drugs, along with helping the children develop good decision making skills. It is being taught to 5th grade students in the Morrisville-Eaton, Stockbridge Valley, Canastota, Chittenango, Cazenovia, Brookfield, Madison, and DeRuyter school districts. **After-School Program – \$6,300.00** - Operated by [Project Café](#). This program provides and promotes drug and alcohol-free activities, art, music and tutoring for youth in grades 6 to 12 during the after-school hours in the drug, alcohol and tobacco-free environment of Common Grounds in Cazenovia. **Children's Performing Arts Series - \$7,000.00** - Operated by the [Earlville Opera House](#). The Children's Performing Arts Series provides children from throughout Madison County with the opportunity to experience the world of performing arts, and illustrate for them through interactive events how they can become involved in all aspects of the arts. Three children's performances with nationally known performers are scheduled during the summer months. In addition, funds help support a Children's and Teen's Art Show in the Opera House Gallery. **Mentoring Partnership Program - \$7,500.00** - Operated by [Community Action Program](#) for Madison County. This program is for youth ages 8-16 that are in need of a positive adult role model. The program matches the youth with an adult volunteer mentor who will meet weekly with the youth. The goal is to help the youth develop positive social skills, self-esteem and trust through their one-on-one interaction with their adult mentor. Participation

**Pillar Youth Center** – \$4,700.00 - Operated by the Church on the Rock. This program provides youth in grades 6 to 12 with a fun and safe environment for supervised recreation and leisure time activities.
